

BEYNON, THOMAS (died 1729), minister

First minister of Brynberian Independent church (Nevern) and of other congregations in the vicinity. The date of his birth is unknown, but he had a son at Brynllwarch Academy as early as 1696; Brynberian meeting-house is said to have been built in 1690.

Beynon's name appears in [John Evans's](#) lists of 1715; it is added that he lived at Rhydlogyn near Cardigan, and that he died in June 1729.

The fullest account of him is in [D. M. Lewis, *Cofiant Evan Lewis, Brynberian*](#) (Aberystwyth, 1903). In *Llyfryddiaeth y Cymry*, under 1719 (1), we find him mentioned among the sponsors of a book published by [Isaac Carter](#) at Atpar; see also *ibid.*, 1717 (5).
