He was a competent player of the pedal harp, took part in many eisteddfodau and concerts in South Wales, and served as adjudicator in some eisteddfodau. He arranged variations for the harp on ' Merch Megan.'

He died 5 January 1926 and was buried in the graveyard of Tabernacl, Efailisaf.
