The only daughter of **J. R. Ormsby-Gore** (1816 - 1876), 1st baron Harlech. She was first married in 1863 to the **Hon. Lloyd Kenyon** (died 1865); their son, **Lloyd**, succeeded his grandfather in 1869 as **4th baron Kenyon**. Her second marriage in 1880 was to the Reverend Thomas Mainwaring Bulkeley-Owen, of Tedsmore, West Felton (died 1910).

Mrs. Bulkeley-Owen took an active interest in Welsh cultural movements and received the bardic title of Gwenhian Gwynedd. In 1927 she published a history of the parish of Selattyn (Oswestry, n.d.) which includes the **Ormsby-Gore** seat of Brogyntyn. She also supplied the Welsh Land Commission in 1894 with a detailed memorandum on the history of Maelor Saesneg. She died 25 November 1927 at Shrewsbury.
