His poems are preserved in [Peniarth MS 124](#), Jes. Coll. MS. 14, [Llanstephan MS 167](#), Cardiff MSS. 7, 23, 63, Hafod MS. 10, B.M. Add. MSS. 12230, 14991, 15015, [NLW MS 668C](#), [NLW MS 2602B](#), [NLW MS 6681B](#), [NLW MS 8330B](#), and Gwynedd MS. 3. Among them are *cwyddau* in praise of S. Mordeyrn, saint of honour ('Sant anrhyydedd') at Nantglyn, and to S. Dyfnog, and a *cwydd* to God which is attributed in [Peniarth MS 124](#) to [Dafydd ap Hwllyn ap Madog](#). It is uncertain whether he may be associated with the Dafydd Llewelyn who is represented by two *englynion* in [NLW MS 3046D](#).
