Very little of his work is extant. In v there are two copies of his *cywydd* 'to ask Sir Richard for a cloak.' It can be deduced from this that it is addressed to Richard Redman, bishop of St Asaph from 1471 to 1496. In [NLW MS 3047C](#) two *englynion* are attributed to Edward ap Hywel, but [Peniarth MS 99](#) attributes one of them to [Siôn Tudur](#).
