son of **Anarawd ap Rhodri Mawr**. He became ruler of Gwynedd in 916, and after some resistance accepted the overlordship of the West-Saxon monarchy. After his death during an unsuccessful revolt against the English, in 942, his sons were expelled, and authority passed to his cousin, **Hywel Dda**. Though two of these sons, **Iago** and **Ieuaif** were in time restored, his blood was transmitted to the principal dynasty of medieval Gwynedd through a younger son, **Meurig**.
