Nothing is known of his life. Some of his work remains in manuscript, and this includes religious and moral *cywyddau* and *englynion*, a *cywydd* describing a dream the poet had when drunk, a *cywydd* on the palsy, and a *cywydd* of praise to **Huw Nannau** (1580 - 1620, see the article on the family) when the latter became sheriff. In addition to this poetry written in strict metre, one of his poems in free metre is also to be found. The following manuscripts contain examples of his work: **Bodewryd MS 1D** ; Cardiff MSS. 19, 47, 64, 66; Cwrwmawr MS 5B (i-ii) , Cwrwmawr MS 244B ; NLW MS 3047C ; NLW MS 643B , NLW MS 3487E , NLW MS 11816B .
