Born at Llanynys, Denbighshire, c. 1718. A contemporary of [John Williams](#) (Ioan Rhagfyr), he was a good musician. His hymn-tune ' Hero ' appeared in *Haleliwia Drachefn* (G. Harries) and a ' Traethdon ' (chant) in *Y Cerddor Cymreig*, August 1867; he is better known, however, for the hymn-tune called ' Dyfrdwy.' He died in 1798.
