Born 15 June 1835 in Stryd-y-Cerrig, near Llanfwrog church, Ruthin, son of John and Margaret Jones. On 8 April 1845 he was bound apprentice under Isaac Clarke, in the printing office of Mrs. Nathan Maddocks, Ruthin. He was a competitor at eisteddfodau over a long period; he also acted as adjudicator. In [NLW MS 5515C](#) are minutes, in his autograph, of committees which met at Ruthin in connection with the centenary celebration of the founding of Sunday School, whilst in [NLW MS 5517C](#) and [NLW MS 5518B](#) are preserved letters received by him from many men who were prominent in the public and cultural half of the 19th century [NLW MS 5517C](#) also contains copies of a series of articles by him entitled ' Deugain Mlynedd yn ôl.' He died 19 April 1915.
