Born in the parish of Cilrhedyn, Carmarthenshire. By trade a stonemason, he was also a competent musician who performed good service to the community by holding music classes in various districts. Two of his hymn-tunes, 'Cannon Street' and 'Manchester,' were published in *Haleliwia Drachefn*, 1855. He died 3 October 1871 at Ffynnondrain, parish of Newchurch, near Carmarthen.
