Some of his *englynion* and *cwyddau* are preserved in manuscript, among them an elegy to his son ([Llanstephan MS 54](#) (259)), and a *cwydd* ymryson with [Thomas Prys](#) in Jes. Coll. MS. 12 (319), and [NLW MS 3047C](#) (84), and, in the same manuscripts, two *cwyddau* in reply to him by [Thomas Prys](#) and a satirical *cwydd* to him by [Huw Machno](#). In [Llanstephan MS 49](#) (61) and B.M. Add. MS. 14966 (576) there is a *cwydd* to reconcile him and [Siôn Phylip](#) by [Edmund Prys](#).
