

SEFNYN, an Anglesey poet of the second half of the 14th century

He sang the praises of **Tudur ap Goronwy** of Trecastell and Penmynydd (died 1367), and an elegiac *awdl* on his fellow Anglesey poet, **lorwerth ab y Cyriog**, who *fl.* around 1360. He also sang the praises of the wives of his patrons, such as Angharad, 'Dafydd's spouse.' His work has survived only in a confused state in the manuscripts. He was probably the father of the poet **Gwilym ap Sefnyn**.
