His father is stated to have been a native of Sker near Porth-cawl, Glamorganshire, but cannot have owned the estate as the Loughors were in possession at that time. His discreditable life, which is described with full references in the *D.N.B.*, is chiefly concerned with the Popish Plot, and his connection with Wales rests solely upon his ancestry. He died 18 December 1681.
