Born 7 June 1809 at Irvine, Inverness-shire, and died 29 August 1892 in Edinburgh. In 1868 he published *The Four Ancient Books of Wales*, containing Welsh verse from 'The Book of Aneirin', 'The Book of Taliesin', 'The Black Book of Carmarthen', and part of 'The Red Book of Hergest'; the verse was translated for him by **D. Silvan Evans** and **Robert Williams**. This work was an attempt at separating the historical element from the imagined and fictitious in old Welsh poetry.
